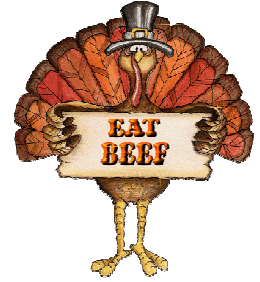

DIRECTOR'S CORNER.....To All Shareholders: ESC Rules and Regulations

The Board of Directors would like to remind Shareholders of the following rules:

Rule 3 (H) Registration

All Shareholders, overnight visitors and tenants are required to fill out the in and out slip located by the office door no later than the next working day after arrival in the park.

Rule 18 Speed Limit

The speed limit in the Park is 10 MPH and is well posted. Speeding is a violation which may result in a fine. Observe stop signs and be extra cautious of cyclists and pedestrians.

Rule 19 (B) ESC Stickers

Two (2) "ESC" fluorescent stickers must be visible on Shareholders' vehicles at all times. One sticker is to be placed on front driver side bumper and the other on the rear driver side bumper.

Rule 22 Lawn Sprinklers

Lawn sprinklers may be operated according to existing Collier County ordinances or restrictions. Current ordinance says house numbers ending in 1,3,5,7,9 can water their lawns on Wed & Sat. House numbers ending in 0,2,4,6,8 can water their lawns on Thurs & Sun. Watering hours are 12 midnight to 10 AM. Non compliance is subject to Collier County fine and/or violation notices from the Association.

Rule 25 Garbage

Garbage and other refuse will be collected in accordance with Rules & Regulations issued by Collier County Waste Management and the Board of Directors. Current ordinance says garbage containers cannot be placed on the street before 6:00 PM the day prior to pickup and must be returned to normal storage place no later than 6:00 PM on the day of pickup. Non compliance is subject to a Collier County fine and/or violation notices from the Association.

Rule 26 Pets

NO PETS are permitted, neither in units nor on ESC Co-op premises.

Rule 29 (A) Street Numbers

The street number for each home must be affixed to the front of the home and must be at least four (4) inches high and easily visible and legible for emergency vehicles. It is suggested that smaller numbers be affixed to the back of the unit.

The Manager will issue violation letters to all who do not comply and in addition you may be fined.

Caring for Your Sewer System— preventing sewer backups in your home

When you use your toilet, shower, washing machine or dishwasher, wastewater leaves your home through pipes that connect to the county sewer system. Flushing or pouring the wrong things down drains can harm the pipes in your home and those that connect to the county sewer system causing raw sewage to back up into your home or be released into the environment.



Do Not Flush

rags/cleaning cloths/Swiffer® pads, disposable diapers, sanitary napkins/care products, cotton balls and swabs/towelettes/handy wipes of any kind, bandages/bandage wrappings, Pharmaceuticals, syringes, sharps, household or hazardous chemicals.

This is NOT a trash can!!

These items can become trapped in sewer lines causing blockages that result in sewage backing up into your home. These items also damage the pumps used in lift stations and foul the treatment process at the wastewater treatment plants. The presence of these items in the sewer system poses very real health risks to the workers maintaining the system.

How the Sewer System Works

Homes (including condominiums, and apartments), and businesses (like hotels, restaurants, and shopping centers) are connected to the sanitary sewer system through a service lateral line, or private sewer line, that connects to the sewer main buried under the street in front of the house or building.

All of the waste and water flushed through all of the drains in your home - including the toilets, sinks, showers, bathtubs, dish and clothes washing machines - travels from your home's plumbing system through the service lateral line to the sewer main. The wastewater then travels through the main, and a series of pumping stations, to a wastewater treatment facility. The waste water is then put through a series of separation, cleansing, and disinfection steps to produce reclaimed water that is then returned to the community for beneficial reuse as irrigation quality water.

In the Kitchen

Remember that toilets are not the only thing in your home connected to the sewer system. Kitchen sinks and garbage disposals drain to the sewer system as well. Grease is a major problem for sewer systems. Grease builds up inside sewer pipes, restricting the flow of wastewater, causing backups.

Cooking fats, oils, and grease.... Never pour these down the drain. Instead, pour them into a disposable container, such as a tin can or a milk carton, cool and then put in the garbage. Remember that cheese, butter, salad dressings, sauces, and gravies contain fats, oils, and grease. Scrape these items into the garbage.

Food scraps and solids.... Garbage disposals do not always reduce these to the point they will flush clear of your lateral line. Solids such as fruit and vegetable rinds and peels, eggshells, and chicken bones should be put in the garbage.

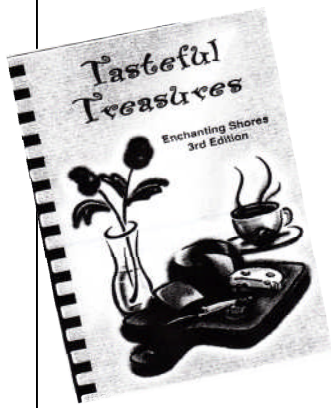
In the Yard

Tree roots seek water sources, such as cracked sewer lines. Once the roots have penetrated the line, they can create dense mats and trap materials, blocking the line and causing a backup in your home.



We have experienced excessive water and sewer bills this past year and we need your help finding leaks.... Please check for leaky faucets, continuous running toilets, leaking sprinkler heads and connections, etc. If every home has one small leak...multiply it times the number of residents, it equals a lot of water going down the drain unnecessarily!

When Is Daylight Savings? Standard time starts: Sunday, November 7th, 2010

Daylight Savings time begins each year at 2:00 A.M. on the second Sunday in March, with clocks moving ahead one hour. Standard time begins each year at 2:00 A.M. on the first Sunday in November, with clocks moving one hour back.

Prior to 2007, the DST change in the U.S. occurred in April and standard time resumed in October. The law extending daylight savings time by almost two months was signed into law by George W. Bush in 2005.

THE HISTORY OF VETERANS DAY

OVERVIEW OF VETERANS DAY

Veterans Day, formerly Armistice Day, is the anniversary of the ending of World War I. In the United States it is celebrated as a federal holiday on November 11. Veterans Day has been observed annually on this date since 1978, except for a brief period when it was celebrated on the fourth Monday of October.

HISTORY OF VETERANS DAY

Following World War II, the name of the holiday was changed (enacted June 1, 1954) to Veterans Day to honor those who died in all American wars. The day has since evolved to primarily be a time of honoring living veterans who have served in the military during wartime or peacetime, partially due to competition with Memorial Day, which primarily honors the dead.

VETERANS DAY TRIVIA

24.9 million.....The number of military veterans in the United States.

1.7 million.....The number of veterans who are women.

9.7 million.....The number of veterans who are age 65 or over.

6.....Number of states with 1 million or more veterans. These states are California (2.3 million), Florida (1.8 million), Texas (1.7 million), New York (1.2 million), Pennsylvania (1.2 million) and Ohio (1.1 million).

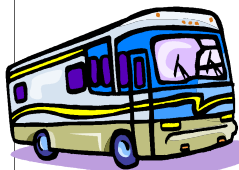
